

Karadi Tales is an award-winning independent children's book publishing house. It was founded in 1996 by a group of writers, musicians, and educators who wanted to create a space for Indian culture in children's literature. The organization was a pioneer in the children's audiobooks market in India.

Karadi Tales produces high-quality picture books that feature a variety of illustration styles including traditional Indian art such as Gond, Warli, and Kalamkari, apart from palette-knife art, watercolours, mixed media, and more, with the view of enhancing children's visual literacy and exposure to various forms of art. The books, that are written by gifted authors, cover subjects such as environment conservation, bullying prevention, kindness, animal welfare, gender, and adoption without sounding preachy.

Karadi Tales' picture books have a presence all over the world, with several international publishing houses buying rights to the books and translating them into many different languages. The beautiful authentic art has received international appreciation, with readers and publishers from other countries admiring the rich, earthy colours, bold lines, and distinctive tribal art used in the illustrations. The books cover important themes such as gender, sustainability, disability, the environment, bullying, and more.

In 2020, Karadi Tales won The Audiobook Publisher of the Year at the London Book Fair International Excellence Awards for its "firm commercial focus on webbased strategy, and continued dedication to both educating and entertaining young people in India."

Karadi Tales' picture books have been featured in various prestigious lists such as White Ravens, International Board on Books for Young People, the New York Public Library's Best Children's Books, the Dolly Parton Imagination Library Program, USBBY's Outstanding International Book list, and more. In 2017, Karadi Tales was shortlisted for the Best Publisher Award (Asia) at the Bologna Children's Book Fair.

A whole generation has grown up on Karadi Tales, and a new generation is now discovering it. And Karadi the Bear continues to be on the lookout for stories that are magical, meaningful, and memorable, all at once.
